Disposal at these facilities is limited to three cubic yards per day. These locations are for residential waste only, no glass, construction debris or businesses.

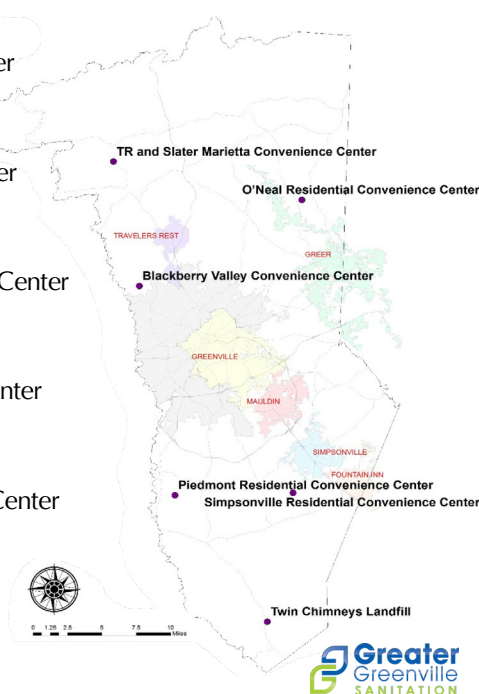

# Recycling Guidelines

## Banned But Recyclable

The following items are banned from South Carolina landfills but can be recovered and recycled.

- Electronic waste (tv's, computers, monitors, lap tops, mobile devices) - Accepted at County Convenience Centers and Twin Chimneys landfill.
- Lead-Acid Batteries – Accepted at time of purchase of a new battery and at County Convenience Centers and Twin Chimneys landfill.
- Motor Oil/Oil Filters – Accepted at many auto parts stores and at County Convenience Centers and Twin Chimneys landfill.

## Beyond the Curb

- Fluorescent light bulbs - Accepted at most home improvement stores.
- Ink and toner cartridges –Accepted at most office supply stores.
- Plastic bags - Reuse, or accepted at most grocery stores.

## We Do Not Accept

- Glass
- 3-ring binders
- Animal waste
- Ceramics
- Clothing and footwear
- Chip bags and candy wrappers
- Diapers
- Extension cords and outdoor or holiday lighting
- Flexible plastics and tubing like hoses, fishing line, etc
- Food waste
- Household oils and greases
- Household batteries
- Mirrors
- Medical waste containers/needles & sharps
- Plastic bags, sheet, and film
- Plastic or disposable cups
- Propane/Helium/Pressurized cans and cylinders
- PVC pipes and tubing
- Styrofoam cups, plates, and packaging materials
- Toxic containers (paint, oil, antifreeze, pesticides, etc.)

No separating required. **DO NOT BAG YOUR RECYCLABLES.** All recyclables should be placed loose in your recycling container.



## Metals

Aluminum, tin, steel cans, empty aerosol cans.



## Plastics

Plastics containers like bottles, jars, jugs, tubs, toys, etc. (typically any plastic with a screw top or neck)



## Paper & Cardboard

Place cardboard and paper at the bottom of the container to save space and reduce litter.

Flattened cardboard, loose paper, newspapers, magazines, catalogs, junk mail, books, milk and juice cartons, frozen food boxes, etc.
